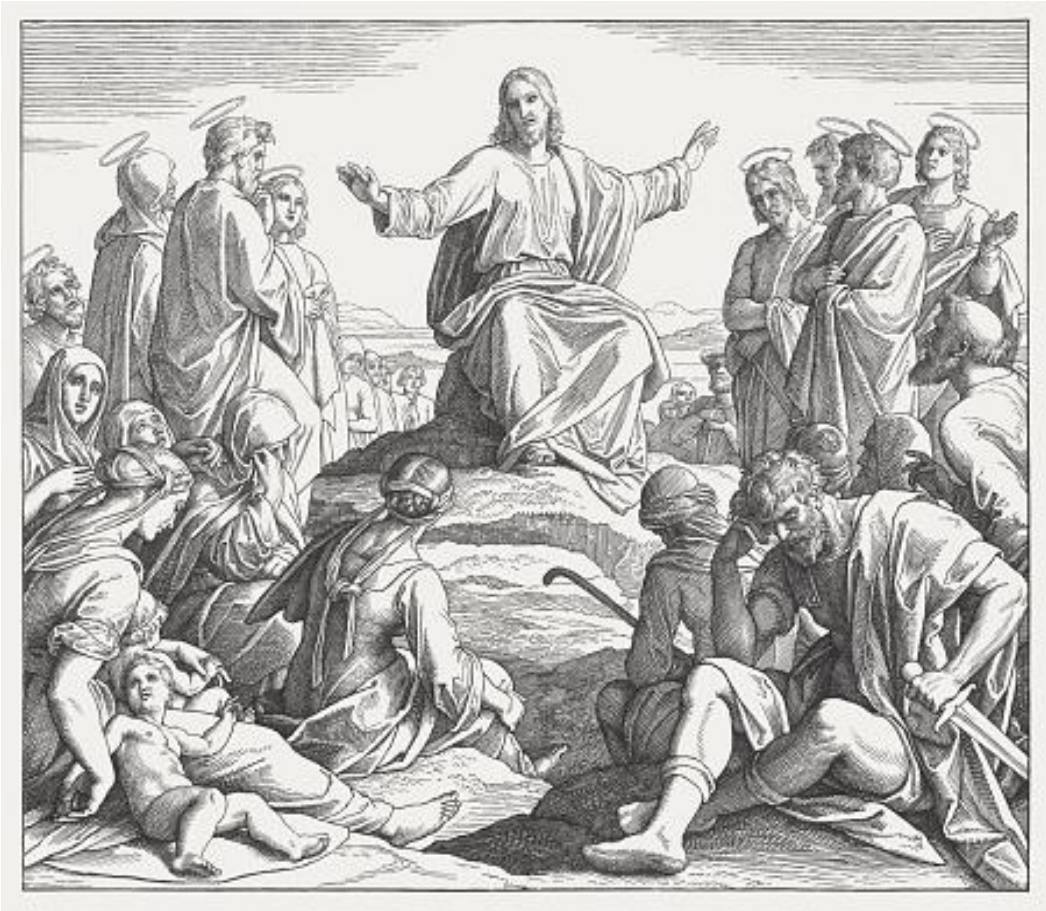

What does God desire for his people? Today’s passage from Micah reveals God in controversy with his people—for all of God’s saving actions, the people of Israel offer only burnt offerings, when God desires that they do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with him. In Matthew, Jesus preaches the Sermon on the Mount, where conventional wisdom is turned upside down. Jesus proclaims that God’s blessings fall upon those who mourn, who are meek, who are poor in spirit, and who are persecuted.
